The Arizona Poor People's Campaign (AZ PPC) is a state committee in the Poor People's Campaign: National Call for Moral Revival. The overall goals of the Poor People's Campaign are:

- to shift the false narratives and to build power among the 140 million poor and low-income people;
- to confront the interlocking injustices of systemic racism, poverty, ecological devastation, militarism and the war economy and the false moral narrative of religious nationalism.

The AZ PPC is organizing the 2.7 million people in Arizona that are poor or low-income across the state so that their voices will be heard in the streets, in

the media, and at the ballot box. NONVIOLENCE LEGACY PROGRAM



The Nonviolence Legacy Program (NLP) was created in 2008 to share the skills, knowledge and wisdom of the nonviolent strategies used by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (Kingian Nonviolence) and others. NLP advocates alternatives to violence by teaching that Nonviolence is a courageous lifestyle. In 2021 NLP began work on social justice issues with the emphasis on housing. We continue to serve our Community with food and clothing distributions in collaboration with our partners. DISENTANGLER: ART AGAINST SEXUAL VIOLENCE


